



Inflatable General Safety Rules

- Participant safety depends on you. As the lessee of an inflatable unit, your personal supervision is absolutely required at all times a unit is in your possession. The safety of all participants is your responsibility. As the adult supervisor, you should position yourself in close proximity of the entrance to the ride and be prepared to assist riders when they enter/exit the ride.
- Only compatible age groups and size shall play on a unit at the same time. The maximum number of participants in each group that should be allowed on an inflatable at one time is as follows:

Age Groups	Smaller Unit	15 x 15 Unit	Combo	Slide
5 and Under	7	8	6	Maximum 2 riders
6-11 years	5	6	4	of comparable
12 and over	3	4	3	weight and size

- All participants must remove shoes, glasses, belts, jewelry, and other sharp objects before using any inflatable.
- Somersaults, diving, climbing, wrestling, piling, flips, and rough play are not allowed. Such activity may result in neck, back, or other injuries to riders. No climbing on walls, sides or top of inflatable.
- No smoking or other open flames are allowed on or around any inflatable unit.
- No food, candy, gum, or other sticky substances are allowed on or around any inflatable unit.
- No pets, toys or sharp instruments are allowed on the inflatable unit at any time.
- No face paints, party poppers, colored streamers, confetti, glitter or silly string may be used on or around any inflatable unit.
- No one under the influence of alcohol, drugs or any other intoxicating substance is allowed on any inflatable.
- Do not operate any inflatable unit in rain, lightning or winds exceeding 25 mph.
- Never place a water hose or water in general onto the inflatable. If the inflatable should become wet, have an adult wipe down unit before riders return as a wet inflatable is a slippery inflatable and falls can occur.
- Pregnant women, small infants, individuals with pre-existing injuries and others susceptible to injury from falls, bumps or bouncing are not permitted in or on the inflatable unit at any time.



Inflatable Emergency Procedures

An inflatable unit can be a lot of fun when operated responsibly. As the lessee, you assume full responsibility for the safe use and operation of the inflatable unit. Please ensure proper safety precautions are followed at all times. The operation of an inflatable unit is relatively straightforward, but occasionally you might encounter a problem. If something goes wrong, try these suggestions to get your party back on track.

LOSS OF POWER

If the inflatable unit should begin to deflate, don't panic! Help all participants to safely exit the inflatable. Stay calm. Once all participants have been successfully removed from the inflatable unit, follow the below steps:

- Ensure the blower is turned on and extension cord is plugged-in to a GFCI outlet.
- Check your fuse box or breaker box. If the breaker has been tripped, the circuit is overloaded. Unplug electrical devices on the same circuit and reset the circuit, or plug the inflatable unit into another GFCI outlet on a different circuit.
- Test the outlet with another electrical device. If other devices (i.e., a hair dryer) work on the outlet, it's possible the blower has been damaged. In this situation, Call Balloons, Etc. at 319-298-9999 or 319-560-7379 after hours.

RAIN

Do not attempt to use the inflatable unit in the event of rain. The surface of the unit can become slippery and create a potentially unsafe environment for participants. In the event of precipitation, help participants exit the inflatable, disconnect the blower and take it indoors, fold the inflatable unit in half and fold the tarp over the top.

STRONG WINDS

Do not attempt to use the inflatable unit during winds in excess of 25 miles per hour. Strong winds can cause the unit to become unstable and create a potentially unsafe environment for participants. If at any time the wind starts to lift the inflatable off the ground, help participants safely exit the inflatable and deflate the unit. The inflatable until should not be used again until the wind has subsided.
